

#### THE FUTURE OF THE KERNY

On February 3rd, Kerny stakeholders from PA Department of Environmental Protection (the owners of the Kernsville Dam property), Pennsylvania State Police, Tilden Township Police, Reading and Northern Railroad Police, PA Fish and Boat Commission, Hamburg Fire Company, State Senator Argall's office, Tilden Township, Schuylkill River National and State Heritage Area and Blue Mountain Wildlife met at the Tilden Township Municipal Building to discuss plans for the Kernsville Dam Recreation Area. The focus of the meeting was on the coming summer; what PA DEP has done to date, what it could do to help local law enforcement prepare for the summer and what local law enforcement's plans are to head off the summer's crowds.

Representatives from PA DEP reviewed the efforts to date, including the closing of much of the Kerny to the general public in late August, the erection of the gate on Kernsville Dam Road and the installation of signage warning the public against trespassing. They then reported that they had included \$10.8 million dollars in their proposed budget for the removal of the Kernsville Dam, but quickly noted that the funding for the removal was subject to the Governor's agreement and the approval of the budget by the State Legislature and the Governor. They noted that

the removal process could be a lengthy one but expressed hope that the dewatering of the reservoir could be accomplished as quickly as possible to remove the attractiveness of The Rock and the Kernsville Dam for thrill-seekers. It was mentioned that PA DCNR may be interested in taking over the property after the dam is removed.

In the short-term, the representatives of PA DEP, with the advice of local law enforcement, planned to add more signage in the area, including locations along the Bartram Trail that are currently being used to access Kernsville Dam Road to the north of the desilting basin.

Local law enforcement representatives noted that foot traffic in the "No Trespassing" zone has been much lighter since September, but that there are still individuals and groups unknowingly or intentionally trespassing to get to the Dam or the Rock. Representatives from the law enforcement agencies plan to increase awareness of the "No Trespassing" areas through their websites and social media, hoping to prevent the crowds from arriving in the first place.

Representatives from PA DEP noted that they are still working on a new lease agreement for the property but expressed that it was not their intention to adversely impact Blue Mountain Wildlife's traditional activities at the Kerny.
