

HISTORY HIKE BOOKENDS BMW'S 2020 EVENTS

The second and final Blue Mountain Wildlife event of 2020 occurred on Saturday October 24th. Thirteen people gathered at the Monument Parking Lot on a cloudy and breezy afternoon to take a walk back in time. Pat Adams, BMW's resident historian, led the group back Kernsville Dam Road to the New Kernsville Dam. The first stop—1949 and the construction of the Dam. The group learned the story of the efforts to restore life to the coal silt-choked Schuylkill Rover and how the great slab of concrete before them did just that.

The next stop was the Upper Parking Lot and a bit further back in time, to the era of the Schuylkill Canal and the Big Blue Mountain Dam—its double set of locks visible on the far shore. Pat related the rise of the Schuylkill Canal and the coal trade that drove it. As the afternoon breeze turned distinctly cooler, the group hiked along the river, venturing further back in time to the early 1920's. When they reached Pulpit Rock, they were treated to the story of the "Moving of the Schuylkill River" - the engineering marvel of the day—and the growth of the railroads between Philadelphia and coal country.

After the hike back to the Upper Parking Lot, the group finished the journey back in time with a visit to 1916 and the Little Blue Mountain Dam site and the coal wharf ruins just upstream. Pat told the story of the final days of the Schuylkill Canal and the rise of the Reading Railroad. As the sun started to peak out from behind the clouds, the group returned to the 21st Century and the Monument Parking Lot.
