- Maintaining the wheelchairaccessible Therman Madeira Switchback trail that links the Hamburg Community Park with the Schuylkill River Heritage Area's John Bartram Trail.
- Pursuing a cooperative agreement with the Schuylkill River Heritage Area regarding the maintenance of the John Bartram Trail.
- > Constructing benches and wildlife observation areas at various locations along the trail system.
- Maintaining two small outdoor classroom areas for the purpose of conducting nature, wildlife and environmental programs.
- > Enhancing the area with established native plant and butterfly gardens, and interpretive trails.
- > Enhancing the area around the Monument Parking Lot.
- > Constructing a trail from the Pump Station to the Kernsville Dam Monument paralleling Industrial Drive
