In September of 2021, Hurricane Ida paid a short visit to the Kerny and points north, dumping a bit of rain that caused the Schuylkill River to overflow its banks. The flood waters, in concert with a number of downed trees, swept the crushed stone topping from the Therman Madeira Switchback and scored deeply into the gravel sub-base in certain spots. Temporary repairs were quickly effected, but the trail remained in a rough state while BMW sought a permanent fix. In December of 2022, that fix arrived.

During the summer, Julia Hurle of Schuylkill River Greenway contacted BMW with the news that SRG was going to be applying for grant money to repair Hurricane Ida flood damage and the BMW should gather quotes to get the work done. For a few months, BMW and SRG coordinated their efforts to find a reasonably-priced contractor and secure the funding to get the job

done. The efforts paid off when Rutledge Excavators, the contractor on the I-78 Bridge project, stepped up and proposed repair work within the available funding limits. After an agreement was reached, things moved quickly. With good weather in the second week of December, the Rutledge crew quickly repaired the flood damage and restored the Switchback to its pre-flood condition. Now walkers, runners and bikers can enjoy a smoother trail surface while they enjoy the beautiful scenery along the Schuylkill River.




